- Publishing the curriculum as an open educational resource (OER) to reduce implementation costs
- Providing implementation support services, including comprehensive professional development, professional learning community engagements, and print services

The curriculum is a comprehensive language arts program for grades 9-12 that empowers students with the literacy to succeed in college, careers, and civic life.

District Leader Services

Diagnostic Assessment: NTC provides a systems-level diagnostic assessment to understand the current state of a partner district's curriculum and professional learning efforts. Flexible days, virtual or in-person

Systems-Level Consultation: District leaders and NTC set joint goals and measures for the work in order to meaningfully monitor progress over the partnership. 3 sessions; 2-3 hours each, virtual or in-person

Progress Monitoring Visits: NTC staff support district leaders with systems-level progress monitoring around curriculum implementation 3 full-day in-person visits, 2-3 times a year

School Leader Services

Professional Learning for School Leaders: Focused on what high-quality Odell curriculum implementation looks like for diverse learners 4-8 full-day sessions, virtual or in-person

Forums for School Leaders: 3-hour sessions intended to support the application of the professional learning described above 4-10 3-hour sessions, virtual or in-person

Individualized Coaching for School Leaders

Flexible days, virtual or in-person

Coach/Mentor Services

Professional Learning for Coaches or New Teacher Mentors: Focused on best practices in coaching and unpacking the Odell curriculum so that coaches/mentors are ready to support teachers. 5 full-day sessions, virtual or in-person

Forums for Coaches or New Teacher Mentors: 3-hour sessions support year-long application of the professional learning described above 4-10 3-hour sessions, virtual or in-person

Individualized Coaching for Coaches or New Teacher Mentors Flexible days, virtual or in-person

Teacher Services

Knowledge Building Sessions for Teachers: Content sessions focused on understanding students' unique learner profiles and unlocking the power of the Odell high school curriculum. Typically 6 2.5-hour sessions, virtual or in-person

Professional Learning Community (PLC) Support for Teachers: NTC staff members provide real-time support to teachers in unpacking the standards and curricular units, analyzing student work, and/or building lesson plans to attend to diverse learner needs and assets.
